

Specialist Basketball Program Terms and Conditions

Before enrolling your child, we kindly request that you carefully review and agree to the following terms and conditions. Your agreement to these terms will ensure the safety and success of your child in our program.

Program Fee for 2024

As you are aware there is a general increase in fees for next year which will also affect our program cost for 2024. The annual fee of \$530 is required prior to the commencement of Term 1, Week 1. This will be invoiced in mid-January separately from your tuition fees. It is payable via the College <u>Parent Lounge</u>. Enrolment will automatically continue each year with the payment of the annual fee prior to the commencement of Term 1. Explanation of Fee:

- Partnership with Coaching Hoops to provide early morning training and match coaching.
- Program match costs for selected players. Game selection for all years is merit based for the majority of competitions. There will be an opportunity for at least one tournament for each player.
- We will endeavour to develop the program to include as many games as possible for all participants. At this stage we look to include each player in at least one competition a year.
- Specialist Basketball Electives are offered as part of the College timetable as an optional supplement and are covered by College fees (program fees do not cover the cost of running electives). Please note, as with all other classes these electives are subject to teacher and relief availability.

Year 11 and 12s

Year 11 and 12 students will be offered the opportunity to pay half of the program cost of \$265 if they wish to continue with the program but their schedule makes an ongoing commitment to the program unmanageable. Students choosing this option will only be eligible to attend 50% of morning training sessions. Should year 11 and 12 students wish to attend all trainings, the full program fee will be required.

Morning Training Attendance

Attendance for morning training will be done through a new system in 2024. This system requires students to bring their <u>smart rider card</u> to 'sign in' in the mornings when they arrive. Year 7s will be tracked differently until after they have received their first smart rider in the new year.

Morning attendance is key for skill development and team selection particularly for year 7s as this is the main contact with the coaches. If a student is unable to attend training it is expected that the college will be notified via email basketball@kennedy.wa.edu.au or direct message to the program coordinator.

Probation Period

The probation period for the Specialist Basketball Program is the first two weeks of Term 1. This is an opportunity for students and families to see if the program is suitable for them. If your child chooses not to continue after the probation trial period, a <u>Withdrawal Form</u> must be completed online. This form must be received within 7 days of completion of the probation trial period. A refund of fees minus a \$50 administration fee will be available.

Withdrawal

If a student withdraws more than 7 days after the probation period for a non-medical reason they **will not** be entitled to a refund.

Students wishing to withdraw for major medical reasons must provide supporting documentation (including a medical certificate), refunds will be assessed on a case by case basis. If a student wishes to withdraw at the end of the year, a <u>Withdrawal Form</u> must be completed online on the College website.

The Specialist Basketball Coordinator reserves the right to remove a student from the program on the grounds of poor behaviour during the program and timetabled classes. Students required to be withdrawn on the grounds of poor behaviour will not be eligible for a refund.

Interschool College Representation and Commitment

- Year 7-10 students are strongly encouraged to take all opportunities to represent the College when available. These include predominantly ACC and SSWA competitions along with other tournaments held throughout the year. O
- Year 10-12 students enrolled in the program are required to represent the College for SAS competitions and SSWA afterschool competitions.

Program Uniforms

Program participants are required to purchase a Kennedy reversible singlet from the College Uniform Shop and wear it with their College sport shorts and College House shirts to ALL training and elective sessions. Due to the importance of these reversible singlets in training and electives, demerits will be applied to students who do not bring theirs.

The College will provide all interschool playing tops, singlets and shorts (where applicable) for competitions.

Risk Warning
