



Specialist Cricket Program Terms and Conditions

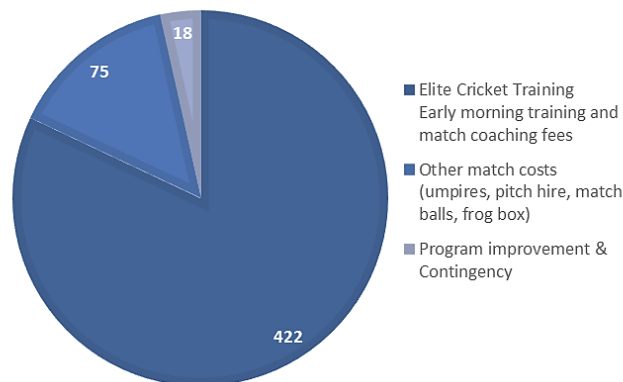
Program Fee for 2023

As you are aware there is a general increase in fees for next year which will also affect our program cost for 2023. The annual fee of \$515 is required prior to the commencement of Term 1, Week 1. This will be invoiced in mid-January separately from your tuition fees. It is payable via [Parent Lounge](#). Enrolment will automatically continue each year with the payment of the annual fee prior to the commencement of Term 1.

Explanation of Fee:

- Partnership with Elite Cricket Training to provide early morning training and match coaching
- Program match costs for selected players. The program provides opportunities to compete for match selection. Match selection for years 7 and 8 has a participation focus and years 9+ is merit based.
- Continuous development of the program. In 2023 this will include the introduction of 'frogbox' which gives parents the ability to watch live game feed and enables match revision coaching and development.

Specialist Cricket Electives are offered as part of the College timetable as an optional supplement and are covered by College fees (program fees do not cover the cost of running electives). Please note, as with all other classes these electives are subject to teacher and relief availability

Year 11 and 12s

Year 11 and 12 students will be offered the opportunity to pay half of the program fee of \$257 if they wish to continue with the program. With this comes the introduction of specialised coaching plans where students will meet one on one with coaches to develop a personal plan to improve their performance and process goals. Year 11 and 12 students will not be expected to be a part of general training with year 9s and 10s but will be invited to train on the same mornings. This will also mean that we will ensure they have matches throughout the cricket season.

Match Representation

In 2023 we will be continuing to compete in the Kim Hughes Shield as well as other senior school matches, however, to be a part all players must either be a part of the program through the terms listed above. Alternatively, if a student in year 11 or 12, has a schedule that makes an ongoing commitment to the program unmanageable there will be a nominal fee of \$150 in order to play in this squad. This will cover associated costs of provided uniform and match costs including the use of frog box, match balls and coaching.

Probation Period

The probation period for the Specialist Cricket Program is the first two weeks of Term 1. This is an opportunity for students and families to see if the program is suitable for them. If your child chooses not to continue after the probation trial period, a [Withdrawal Form](#) must be completed online. This form must be received within 7 days of completion of the probation trial period. A refund of fees minus a \$50 administration fee will be available.

Withdrawal

If a student withdraws more than 7 days after the probation period for a non-medical reason they will not be entitled to a refund.

Students wishing to withdraw for major medical reasons must provide supporting documentation (including a medical certificate), refunds will be assessed on a case by case basis. If a student wishes to withdraw at the end of the year, a [Withdrawal Form](#) must be completed online on the College website.

The Head of Sport reserves the right to remove a student from the program on the grounds of poor behaviour during the program and timetabled classes.

Interschool College Representation and Commitment

- Year 7-10 students are strongly encouraged to take all opportunities to represent the College when available. These include SAS Junior Competitions, SSWA and other tournaments held throughout the year.
- Year 10-12 students enrolled in the program are required to represent the College for SAS competitions and SSWA day competitions.

Program Uniforms

In 2023 it will be our 10 year anniversary and so the College will be purchasing new playing tops for all players as we transition to coloured playing tops. Please communicate your child's sizing by 2 December 2022 so that we are able to have shirts ready in the new year.

The 1st XI players and senior squad will receive full coloured uniforms along with the ability to choose their player number (with year 12s getting first pick then down from there) and have their last name printed on the back of their shirt. Any replacement tops and from 2024 onwards players will be required to purchase the remodelled Kennedy cricket shirt from the College

Uniform Shop. Players are able to wear their PE uniform to morning trainings, or their old white cricket shirt. We will reserve the Kennedy cricket shirt for matches only.
